The intention for the changes is to improve transfer agreements and develop more flexible program parameters. The changes made were to the course requirements. Some courses were removed, and some courses were added. They also included some optional courses that students could take.

The program shuffled some of the courses around and with this shuffle a few new courses were needed. This change will make things easier for the students and they will have scheduled shop time for their course. The new course are DFAB 111, 112 and 113. DFAB 205 will be moved from the Fall term to the Winter term.
